The general objective of this MoU is to stimulate and facilitate the development of collaborative and mutually beneficial activities which serve to enhance the Intellectual, Academic and Cultural collaboration and development and hence agree as follows:

**The Objectives of MoU are:**

1. To promote and enhance academic standard.
- 2 To provide advice for implementation of quality education in both institutions.
3. To carry out cooperative activities for mutual benefit.

**Proposed Models of Collaboration:**

1. To exchange faculty.
2. To undertake student exchange.
3. To organize guest lectures jointly.
4. To organize other academic and social activities.
5. To organize Workshops/Conferences /Seminars Jointly.

**Terms and Conditions:**

1. This MoU may be amended, renewed and terminated by mutual agreement of the institution at any time
2. Either institution shall have the right to terminate this MoU upon 60 days prior written notice to the other institute,

**Duration of MoU:**

This MoU, unless extended by mutual written consent of the institute, shall expire in **FIVE YEARS** after the effective date specified in the opening paragraph. However, a review the MoU shall be extended for another five years by mutual consent.

# Programme "Education in Universal Human Values"

## Preamble:

Bharati Vidyapeeth's New Law College, Sangli and the Bahá'í Academy, Panchgani, recognizing the strengths and achievements of the College in offering opportunities for higher education to hundreds of deserving students from Sangli and beyond; and recognizing its high aspiration and commitment to educating future generations to be ethical professionals, creative and informed citizens with strong moral capabilities for personal development and contributing to unity, prosperity and social progress;

And bearing in mind that the Bahá'í Academy, a Recognized Institution of Shivaji University, is an institution engaged in research and action in the field of value education for institutions of higher learning and its commitment to the above aspirations by providing a programme of international standard on Education in Universal Human Values which includes a number of courses for faculty members, administrative/non-teaching staff members, U.G. and P.G. students, as well as research and extension activities; and noting the recognition that the Bahá'í Academy has achieved in providing this programme to institutions of higher learning in Maharashtra and other states, a programme that is universally relevant, with secular modules, prepared by well-qualified national and international educationists and trainers;

And acknowledging that the benefits, to all the stakeholders, of the Programme of Education in Universal Human Values include such **benefits to the students** as developing core values and attitudes (such as integrity, self-discipline, willingness to learn, flexibility, goal-oriented mindset), employability skills (including attitudinal and affective abilities; team work and decisionmaking) and enhancing communication abilities (such as team discussion, making presentations, consultation, and clear thinking), becoming joyful learners with moral capabilities, leadership abilities and enhanced self-confidence, forming a global perspective and world-view, developing their vision and purpose in life, and serving communities; and In short, they become leaders, but leaders of a new kind; And **benefits to the teachers** include boosting their professional growth through grooming their capabilities to meet the growing challenges of their professional and social mission, redefining their relationship with students, improving their participatory teaching skills and cooperative/experiential learning competence, overhauling their personalities and working out fresh value-based attitudes towards their institution and co-workers; And **benefits to the College** include training teachers in cooperative and participatory learning and becoming mentors for the modules of Education in Universal Human Values, implementing meaningful Offline/Online Service Learning Activities/ Community Engagement projects by the students in the College neighborhood and target communities, promoting quality education by meeting some important criteria set by NAAC (as well as NBA), promoting unity of vision and thought among students and staff who begin changing their attitudes towards their responsibilities, enhancing leadership capabilities within the institution to fulfill its vision and mission and implementing innovative community projects.

**And the tentative annual action plan for the period of this MoU includes the following:**

### 1. Workshops for Faculty Members:

1. Retreat for Principals, Vice-Principals, Coordinators of Education in Universal Human Values
2. Faculty Development Programme on Education in Universal Human Values (3-5 days)
3. Workshop on Developing Moral Capabilities and Professional Skills (5-7 days)

### 2. Implementing the Bahá'í Academy's Courses (As approved by Shivaji University) and Related Activities for Students in Blended Mode:

- Name of the Course:
1. Fostering Personal Development and Social Progress (FPDSP); Every year one module can be implemented (About 30-35 hours of contact session and 25-30 hours of community project per module)
  2. Leadership for Change (Personal and Community) LFC; Every year one module can be implemented (About 30-35 hours of contact session and 25-30 hours of community project per module)



And for P.G. Students:

1. Abilities, Skills and Healthy Attitudes (ASHA) – (About 50 hours of Contact Sessions and 35 hours of extension projects)
2. Workshops on Human Rights and Human Values- (About 10 hours of contact session and 10 hours of community project)

### 3. Workshops for Administrative Staff Members:

Creating Environments Based on Trust and Unity (3-5 days)

### 4. Research Activities:

Research in Value Education (Minor Research Projects and Symposia)

5. Establishment of a Cell for Universal Human Values to initiate, coordinate, evaluate and improve implementation of the Education in Universal Human Values Programme and related activities in the institution.

Therefore the **Bharati Vidyapeeth's New Law College, Sangli AND The Bahá'i Academy, Panchgani**, enter into this MoU which will remain valid for an initial period of **1 year**.

### Terms and Commitments:

The Bahá'i Academy has developed modules and courses as described above, focusing on Universal Human Values, life skills and abilities, healthy attitudes, and leadership capabilities. These modules and courses include universal principles, cooperative and experiential learning, educational activities and games, personal and people skills and reflection upon current problems and challenges facing India and the world, including the problems faced by the younger generation of university and college students. Hence personal development, family environment, career and professional development, and service to society are the contexts within which the development of human values and soft skills are addressed.

#### 1. Commitment of the Bahá'i Academy, Panchgani, Dist. Satara:

- i- The Academy will conduct the necessary Teachers' Orientation and Refresher Workshops on the modules of courses under this Memorandum as per a schedule to be agreed by the Bahá'i Academy, Panchgani, and Bharati Vidyapeeth's New Law College, Sangli. Each faculty member thus trained, called a mentor, will form a Study Group among students and train them as per the course content and methodology. (It is preferable that initially the teacher: student ratio for these Study Groups will be about 1:25). The Bahá'i Academy will provide, for a fee, study kits to the students. Alternatively the Academy Resource Persons will conduct sessions at the College or at the Academy for a fee to be mutually agreed by the College and the Academy.
- ii. The Academy will support the Study Groups that may be formed at the College through visits, at least three times per module, by its Programme Officers, to guide and facilitate progress to fulfil the educational objectives of the programme. They make suggestions and recommendations to the teachers / mentors and College authorities in this regard. These visits will be part of this MoU. No honorarium will be provided to the Academy Officers for these visits. Travel expenses and hospitality will be provided to the Academy representatives by the College.
- iii. The Academy will conduct for a nominal fee, assessment and evaluation of the students' progress at the end of each module and prepare Certificates/Diplomas (and transcripts if required) at the end of each course for the deserving students. Certificates will be issued jointly by the Academy and the College.
- iv. Similarly the teachers who mentor these students, the College Principal, as well as the college, receive from the Bahá'i Academy their respective Certificates of Accomplishment.

- v. The Academy in collaboration with the College will carry out one research project per module with the help of College teachers. It will be related to various aspects/impacts of Education in Universal Human Values, and provide the required guidance for the same.

## 2. Commitment of Bharati Vidyapeeth's New Law College, Sangli

- i- The College will form a "Cell for Universal Human Values" at the College. The cell will be composed of a core group of teachers from among the mentors trained by the Bahá'í Academy, and a representative of the Bahá'í Academy.
- ii- The College decides and informs the Bahá'í Academy the number of students and teachers per year who should join the courses under this MoU.
- iii- The College will provide financial support for workshops/FDPs and administrative staff workshops, as well as symposia, and ensures the students' fees for the courses they take will be paid to the Academy at the time of the registration of the students for each course.
- iv- The College will ensure that on completion of their training the trained teachers (who will become mentors for Education in Universal Human Values Programme) form Study Groups of about 25 students each and implement the course among them. Students can take higher modules each subsequent year and achieve higher levels of competence and certification.
- v- The College will ensure that adequate publicity is given to the courses among the students through various means.
- vi- The College will provide a slot of 3-4 hours in its weekly timetable (for about 10 weeks in one or two semesters) and/or a few days campaign in its annual calendar for implementing contact sessions and service learning activities
- vii- The College will ensure that the mentors' reports and students' assignments are submitted to the Academy on time for evaluation.
- viii- The College nominates a capable and interested member of the Cell for Universal Human Values to be the Programme Coordinator at the College and be the liaison with the Academy.

## 3. Shared Responsibilities:

- i. Both parties to this Agreement undertake to promote its terms, and implement the same in good faith and in a spirit of mutual co-operation.
- ii. Either or both the parties may propose changes to the implementation strategies, bearing in mind the feedback from mentors and course participants. If these changes are accepted in writing by both parties as adding value to the courses, both organizations will continue to present the courses as joint awards.
- iii. Subject to any financial constraints and any such arrangements as may be necessary to safeguard the confidentiality of any information or documents, the parties agree to provide each other with such documents, information or materials as may be necessary for any activity to be carried out under this Agreement.
- iv. Quality control is the shared responsibility of both the parties, each one in its own sphere of activities and responsibilities.
- v. Both the parties share the right of accepting into the course or dismissing students who desire to join the course.
- vi. Although evaluation and assessment is carried out by the Bahá'í Academy, certificates and transcripts are issued jointly by the College and the Academy.

## 4. Final Provisions:

- i. This MoU is valid only if within 3 months from its inception the first training programme stipulated in this MoU is implemented.
- ii. The terms of this Agreement may be amended in writing with the written consent of both organizations. The organizations undertake to resolve in good faith any concerns or questions which may arise regarding the terms and implementation of this Agreement.
- iii. Either organization may terminate this MoU by giving three months prior notice in writing to the other party, which shall not however affect any legal rights or obligations which may have been created under this MoU.
- iv. This MoU shall also stand terminated for any reason such as legal processes, Acts of the State or similar such exigencies beyond the normal control of the parties concerned and which disable any of the parties hereto from functioning further.

## 5. Arbitration:

Any dispute arising between the parties in relation to or in connection with this MOU shall be resolved by mutual negotiations. In case of any unresolved dispute, the parties shall refer the said dispute for arbitration to the sole arbitrator appointed by the Principal of Bharati Vidyapeeth's New Law College, Sangli, and the Director of the Bahá'í Academy, Panchgani; and the decision of the arbitrator shall be final and binding on both the parties. The provisions of the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996 shall apply to such arbitration. Such arbitration proceeding shall be held at Panchgani.

### Action Plans for 2022-23:


During academic year 2022-23 the following actions will be implemented:

1. Implementing 2-Credit Course on Fostering Personal Development and Social Progress: "Me, My World, My Mission" Course for the second year law students in blended mode.
2. Organizing workshop for the faculty members
3. Organizing retreat for College Principals, Vice- Principals and Coordinators at the Baha'i Academy, Panchgani.

**MACCIA First party** represented herein by their president Shri Santosh Mandlecha (hereinafter referred as '**First Party**', Or **MACCIA** the chamber which expression, unless excluded by or repugnant to the subject or context shall include its successors Mr. Sagar Nagre (Secretary General) - in-office, administrators and assigns).

**AND**

**BHARATI VIDYAPEETH'S NEW LAW COLLEGE SANGLI** Second party, and represented herein by its Dr.Pooja Narwadkar, Principal BV's New Law college, Sangli.(Competent Authority), (hereinafter referred to as "**Second Party**", company which expression, unless excluded by or repugnant to the subject or context shall include its successors - in-office, administrators and assigns).

(First Party and Second Party are hereinafter jointly referred to as 'Parties' and individually as 'Party')

**Preamble:**

Founded in 1927, Maharashtra Chamber of Commerce, Industry & Agriculture is Apex Chamber of the State. With reference to structure of BSPP program, and its benefits to the society at a large, First Party & Second Party believe that memorandum of understanding between themselves shall enable them in achieving their organizational objectives in an effective manner.

The Parties intent to cooperate and focus their efforts on cooperation within area of Skill Based Training, Technical Education, Innovation, Entrepreneurship, Research, and problem solving for industries.

Both Parties, being legal entities in themselves desire to sign this MOU for advancing their mutual interest.

**NOW THEREFORE, IN CONSIDERATION OF THE MUTUAL BENEFITS THE PARTIES HERETO AGREE AS FOLLOWS:**

**CLAUSE 1: AREA OF COLLABORATION AND SCOPE OF MOU**

- 1.1 The aim of this MOU is primarily to establish non-commercial terms of collaboration and co-operation, under which both the parties seeking the MOU- may perform collaborative interests & organizational goals.
- 1.2 Broadly, the areas of collaboration in this MOU are focusing on improvement in following areas for benefit of both industry as well as academia.
  - A) Holistic Interdisciplinary Environment Creation
  - B) Training & Skill Development (staff, students, industry)
  - C) Focus on Academic activities (performance skill based)
  - D) Recruitment related activities (employable product)
- 1.3 Organizing Industry institute joint summit, "On-Line + Off-Line (Hybrid Mode)", enabling both stake holders to express their views / expectations / challenges and discuss possible solutions to overcome them.
- 1.4 Engage Industry leaders in 2 days "On-Line + Off-Line (Hybrid Mode)" faculty



development program per semester to bridge the gap between industry and academia.

- 1.5 Engage best performing students in 1 day "On-Line + Off-Line (Hybrid Mode)" Industry Orientation program.
- 1.6 Organize project competition "On-Line + Off-Line (Hybrid Mode)", enabling best projects from institutes to get presented in front of industries.
- 1.7 Any other activity outside the scope mentioned above can be discussed separately and can be included by agreeing its terms of association in writing. If required separate MOU also can be signed if additional activity demands.

## **CLAUSE 2: CO-OPERATION AND KEY RESPONSIBILITIES**

- 2.1 Both Parties are willing to unite by common interests and objectives mentioned under clause 1 and they shall establish channels of communication and co-operation that will promote and advance their respective operations within the territory/ campus / affiliated institutes & departments of **BHARATI VIDYAPEETH'S NEW LAW COLLEGE SANGLI** (Second Party) and its related wings. The Parties shall keep each other informed of potential opportunities and shall share all information that may be relevant to secure additional value addition opportunities for one another.
- 2.2 Both parties shall nominate 3-member team from each side as point of contact team for effective communication, promotion, and operation supervision.
- 2.3 Understanding the fact that execution is an important task for success of the purpose of this MOU, "MACCIA execution partner" shall be responsible for execution of the tasks under this MOU. Three-member team from parties shall extend their support to provide required information to enable execution partner for communication, promotion, operation, and execution of the program. Sole responsibility of execution and derive measurable outcome from the activity is with the "execution partner".

## **CLAUSE 3: INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY**

- 3.1 Nothing contained in this MOU shall, by express grant, implication, Estoppel (the principle which precludes a person from asserting something contrary to what is implied by a previous action or statement of that person or by a previous pertinent judicial determination) or otherwise, create in either Party any right, title, interest, or license in or to the intellectual property (including but not limited to know-how,

inventions, patents, copy rights and designs) of the other Party.

**CLAUSE 4: IMPLEMENTATION METHODOLOGY**

4.1 All process for registration under this MOU will be guided through information and registration link developed by execution partner on [www.maccia.org.in/bspp.php](http://www.maccia.org.in/bspp.php) and [www.jugaadfunda.com](http://www.jugaadfunda.com)

**CLAUSE 5: LOGO USAGE**

5.1 At all functions/literature related to this MOU activities, both party and execution partner logos will be displayed with equal prominence. Logos usage will be permitted for such designs for promotion of BSPP Program and other mutually agreed programs in writing.

**CLAUSE 6: VALIDITY**

6.1. This MOU is valid, until it is expressly terminated by either party on mutually agreed terms. Review report shall get prepared after every year to evaluate the performance and progress under the MOU. Based on these reports, a detailed outcome focused review will be taken about continuance and further terms of operation based on experience. As a part of this MOU, second party can subscribe separately to get benefitted with other services. All such services and their scope of operation shall get defined separately. Both parties shall fulfil their deliverables under committed program/activity if any at the time of termination.

**CLAUSE 7: RELATIONSHIP AND GOVERNING LAWS**

7.1 It is expressly agreed that First Party and Second Party are acting under this MOU as independent contractors, and the relationship established under this MOU shall not be construed as a partnership. Neither Party is authorized to use the other Party's name in any way, to make any representations or create any obligation or liability, expressed or implied, on behalf of the other Party, without the prior written consent of the other Party. Neither Party shall have, nor represent itself as having, any authority under the terms of this MOU to make agreements of any kind in the name of or binding upon the other Party, to pledge the other Party's credit, or to extend

credit on behalf of the other Party.

### In Relation to the Programme "Education in Universal Human Values"

#### Preamble:

Bharati Vidyapeeth's New Law College, Sangli and the Bahá'í Academy, Panchgani, recognizing the strengths and achievements of the College in offering opportunities for higher education to hundreds of deserving students from Sangli and beyond; and recognizing its high aspiration and commitment to educating future generations to be ethical professionals, creative and informed citizens with strong moral capabilities for personal development and contributing to unity, prosperity and social progress;

And bearing in mind that the Bahá'í Academy, a Recognized Institution of Shivaji University, is an institution engaged in research and action in the field of value education for institutions of higher learning and its commitment to the above aspirations by providing a programme of international standard on Education in Universal Human Values which includes a number of courses for faculty members, administrative/non-teaching staff members, U.G. and P.G. students, as well as research and extension activities; and noting the recognition that the Bahá'í Academy has achieved in providing this programme to institutions of higher learning in Maharashtra and other states, a programme that is universally relevant, with secular modules, prepared by well-qualified national and international educationists and trainers;

And acknowledging that the benefits, to all the stakeholders, of the Programme of Education in Universal Human Values include such **benefits to the students** as developing core values and attitudes (such as integrity, self-discipline, willingness to learn, flexibility, goal-oriented mindset), employability skills (including attitudinal and affective abilities; team work and decision making) and enhancing communication abilities (such as team discussion, making presentations, consultation, and clear thinking), becoming joyful learners with moral capabilities, leadership abilities and enhanced self-confidence, forming a global perspective and world-view, developing their vision and purpose in life, and serving communities; and In short, they become leaders, but leaders of a new kind; And **benefits to the teachers** include boosting their professional growth through grooming their capabilities to meet the growing challenges of their professional and social mission, redefining their relationship with students, improving their participatory teaching skills and cooperative/experiential learning competence, overhauling their personalities and working out fresh value-based attitudes towards their institution and co-workers; And **benefits to the College** include training teachers in cooperative and participatory

learning and becoming mentors for the modules of Education in Universal Human Values, implementing meaningful Service Learning Activities/ Extension Projects by the students in the College neighborhood and target communities, promoting quality education by meeting some important criteria set by NAAC (as well as NBA and TEQIP), promoting unity of vision and thought among students and staff who begin changing their attitudes towards their responsibilities, enhancing leadership capabilities within the institution to fulfill its vision and mission and implementing innovative community projects.

**And the tentative annual action plan for the period of this MoU includes the following:**

**1. Workshops for Faculty Members:**

1. Faculty Development Programme on Education in Universal Human Values (3-5 days)
2. Workshop on Developing Moral Capabilities and Professional Skills (5-7 days)

**2. Implementing the Bahá'í Academy's Courses (Preferably as an Optional or Choice Based Credit Course) and Related Activities for Students:**

Name of the Course: 1. Fostering Personal Development and Social Progress (FPDSP); Every year one module can be implemented (About 30-35 hours of contact session and 25-30 hours of community project per module)  
2. Leadership for Change (Personal and Community) LFC; Every year one module can be implemented (About 30-35 hours of contact session and 25-30 hours of community project per module)

And for P.G. Students:

1. Abilities, Skills and Healthy Attitudes (ASHA) – (About 50 hours of Contact Sessions and 35 hours of extension projects)
2. Workshops on Human Rights and Human Values- (About 10 hours of contact session and 10 hours of community project)

**3. Workshops for Administrative Staff Members:**

Creating Environments Based on Trust and Unity (3-5 days)

**4. Research Activities:**

Research in Value Education (Minor Research Projects and Symposia)

**5. Establishment of a Cell for Universal Human Values** to initiate, coordinate, evaluate and improve implementation of the Education in Universal Human Values Programme and related activities in the institution.

Therefore the **Bharati Vidyapeeth's New Law College, Sangli AND The Bahá'í Academy, Panchgani**, enter into this MoU which will remain valid for an initial period of **5 years**.

**Terms and Commitments:**

The Bahá'í Academy has developed modules and courses as described above, focusing on Universal Human Values, life skills and abilities, healthy attitudes, and leadership capabilities. These modules draw on universal principles, cooperative and experiential learning, educational activities and games, personal and people skills and reflection upon current problems and challenges facing India and the world, including the problems faced by the younger generation of university and college students. Hence personal development, family environment, career and professional development, and service to society are the contexts within which the development of human values and soft skills are addressed.

### **1. Commitment of the Bahá'í Academy, Panchgani, Dist. Satara:**

- i- The Academy will conduct the necessary Teachers' Orientation and Refresher Workshops on the modules of courses under this Memorandum as per a schedule to be agreed by the Bahá'í Academy, Panchgani, and Bharati Vidyapeeth's New Law College, Sangli. Each faculty member thus trained, called a mentor, will form a Study Group among students and train them as per the course content and methodology. (It is preferable that initially the teacher: student ratio for these Study Groups will be about 1:25). The Bahá'í Academy will provide, for a fee, study kits to the students.
- ii. The Academy will support these Study Groups through visits, at least three times per module, by its Programme Officers, to guide and facilitate progress to fulfil the educational objectives of the programme. They make suggestions and recommendations to the teachers / mentors and College authorities in this regard. These visits will be part of this MoU. No honorarium will be provided to the Academy Officers for these visits. Travel expenses and hospitality will be provided to the Academy representatives by the College.
- iii. The Academy will conduct for a nominal fee, assessment and evaluation of the students' progress at the end of each module and prepare Certificates/Diplomas (and transcripts if required) at the end of each course for the deserving students. Certificates will be issued jointly by the Academy and the College.
- iv. Similarly the teachers who mentor these students, the College Principal, as well as the college, receive from the Bahá'í Academy their respective Certificates of Accomplishment.
- v. The Academy in collaboration with the College will carry out one research project per module with the help of College teachers. It will be related to various aspects/impacts of Education in Universal Human Values, and provide the required guidance for the same.

### **2. Commitment of Bharati Vidyapeeth's New Law College, Sangli**

- i- The College will form a "Cell for Universal Human Values" at the College. The cell will be composed of a core group of teachers from among the mentors trained by the Bahá'í Academy, and a representative of the Bahá'í Academy.
- ii- The College decides and informs the Bahá'í Academy the number of students and teachers per year who should join the courses under this MoU.
- iii- The College will provide financial support for teachers' workshops/FDPs and administrative staff workshops, as well as symposia, and ensures the students' fees for the courses they take will be paid to the Academy at the time of the registration of the students for each course.
- iv- The College will ensure that on completion of their training the trained teachers (who will become mentors for Education in Universal Human Values Programme) form Study Groups of about 25 students each and implement the course among them. Students can take higher modules each subsequent year and achieve higher levels of competence and certification.
- v- The College will ensure that adequate publicity is given to the courses among the students through various means.
- vi- The College will provide a slot of 3-4 hours in its weekly timetable (for about 10 weeks in one or two semesters) and/or a few days campaign in its annual calendar for implementing contact sessions and service learning activities
- vii- The College will ensure that the mentors' reports and students' assignments are submitted to the Academy on time for evaluation.
- viii- The College nominates a capable and interested member of the Cell for Universal Human Values to be the Programme Coordinator at the College and be the liaison with the Academy.

### **3. Shared Responsibilities:**

- i. Both parties to this Agreement undertake to promote its terms, and implement the same in good faith and in a spirit of mutual co-operation.

- ii. Either or both the parties may propose changes to the implementation strategies, bearing in mind the feedback from mentors and course participants. If these changes are accepted by both parties as adding value to the courses, both organizations will continue to present the courses as joint awards.
- iii. Subject to any financial constraints and any such arrangements as may be necessary to safeguard the confidentiality of any information or documents, the parties agree to provide each other with such documents, information or materials as may be necessary for any activity to be carried out under this Agreement.
- iv. Quality control is the shared responsibility of both the parties, each one in its own sphere of activities and responsibilities.
- v. Both the parties share the right of accepting into the course or dismissing students who desire to join the course.
- vi. Although evaluation and assessment is carried out by the Bahá'í Academy, certificates and transcripts are issued jointly by the College and the Academy.

#### 4. Final Provisions:

- i. This MoU is valid only if within 3 months from its inception the first training programme stipulated in this MoU is implemented.
- ii. The terms of this Agreement may be amended in writing with the written consent of both organizations. The organizations undertake to resolve in good faith any concerns or questions which may arise regarding the terms and implementation of this Agreement.
- iii. Either organization may terminate this MoU by giving three months prior notice in writing to the other party, which shall not however affect any legal rights or obligations which may have been created under this MoU.
- iv. This MoU shall also stand terminated for any reason such as legal processes, Acts of the State or similar such exigencies beyond the normal control of the parties concerned and which disable any of the parties hereto from functioning further.

#### 5. Arbitration:

Any dispute arising between the parties in relation to or in connection with this MOU shall be resolved by mutual negotiations. In case of any unresolved dispute, the parties shall refer the said dispute for arbitration to the sole arbitrator appointed by the Principal of Bharati Vidyapeeth's New Law College, Sangli, and the Director of the Bahá'í Academy, Panchgani; and the decision of the arbitrator shall be final and binding on both the parties. The provisions of the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996 shall apply to such arbitration. Such arbitration proceeding shall be held at Panchgani.





## **Memorandum of Understanding**

**Asian School of Cyber Laws, Pune and  
Bharati Vidyapeeth's New Law College, Sangli  
to Conduct Diploma in Cyber Law Course**

This Memorandum of Understanding (hereinafter referred to as MOU) is signed at Pune on this 13<sup>th</sup> Dec 2018 between Bharati Vidyapeeth's New Law College, Sangli hereinafter referred to as BVNLC and Asian School of Cyber Laws, Pune hereinafter referred to as ASCL.

WHEREAS ASCL has expertise in providing education, training and consultancy in the field of cyber law;

AND WHEREAS BVNLCS is desirous of providing a quality course in cyber law in the distance mode;

NOW THEREFORE BVNLCS and ASCL have decided to enter into this MOU in the manner expressed in this document.

## A. Interpretations

Reference to this MOU or any other instrument is a reference to this MOU or that other instrument as amended, varied, novated or substituted from time to time.

Reference to recitals, clauses, schedules and appendices are references to recitals, clauses, schedules and appendices of and to this MOU.

Reference to any statute or statutory provision includes a reference to that statutory provision as from time to time amended, extended, or re-enacted.

Words importing the singular number shall include the plural and vice versa, and words importing the masculine gender shall include the feminine and neuter gender and vice versa, and words importing persons shall include firms, institutions, trusts, societies, associations of persons, companies and bodies corporate and unincorporated, registered and unregistered.

## B. Terms of MOU

This MOU embodies the following terms:

### I. Name of course and certification

1. ASCL shall jointly conduct the course titled **Diploma in Cyber Law** (hereinafter referred to as DCL) in association with **BVNLCS** in the distance mode. The Syllabus of DCL is hereby attached as **Annexure - I** to this MOU.
2. Upon successful completion of the said course, students shall receive certificate for the same issued jointly by **BVNLCS** and ASCL.

### II. Application forms

1. ASCL shall provide the website page for online application form for prospective students.
2. **BVNLCS** will be responsible for collecting the forms in the physical format. At the end of the admission time, **BVNLCS** will make a final list of all students and will then send a copy of the list to ASCL.

### III. Eligibility for the course

1. The eligibility for the course will be 10+2. BVNLCS will be responsible for conducting the admission process.

### IV. Collection and distribution of Course Fees

1. The fees for the DCL course and the fee sharing between BVNLCS and ASCL shall be as per Annexure - II attached to this MOU.
2. The collection of fees from students will be done by BVNLCS.
3. ASCL's share in the said fee shall be paid to ASCL by BVNLCS by way of cheque payable at Pune in favour of "Asian School of Cyber Laws" as per the following schedule:
  - a. 100% of the total amount of ASCL's share will be payable to ASCL 15 days before the commencement of the course.

### V. Schedule of Course

1. A batch of the DCL course in the distance mode shall begin every six months and shall be of six months' duration from the date of its commencement. The assessment for the DCL course in the distance mode shall be conducted in the month following the month on which the course duration is completed for each batch respectively.
2. The results for the DCL course in the distance mode shall be declared within 30 days of the said examinations.
3. The dates of commencement of course, assessments and declaration of results for each batch are, however, subject to revision after mutual consent by both parties.

### VI. Course material and course methodology

1. ASCL shall provide printed course material to the students enrolled for the DCL course. All expenses relating to the preparation, updation, printing and distribution of the said course material shall be borne by ASCL.
2. BVNLCS will deploy a teacher to teach the course syllabus in 20 hours (5 hours per module). This person will be paid Rs. 250 per hour and this cost shall be borne by ASCL. This is subject to a minimum of 25 students per batch.

## VII. Assessment Procedure and Certification

1. The assessment for the DCL course shall consist of one online examination of two hours consisting of 100 marks.
2. ASCL will be responsible for assessment and it may change the assessment pattern as stated above from time to time if required.
3. ASCL shall be responsible for preparing the assessment questions for the DCL course, and shall provide the question paper for the said assessment to students of the DCL course.
4. The examination center for the distance mode course shall be at the BVNLCS premises.
5. BVNLCS shall be responsible for providing an examination hall with adequate sitting capacity.
6. A student of the DCL course, who has been unsuccessful in the examination of the DCL course or has not been able to appear for the examination, will be allowed to sit for re-examination on the payment of a re-exam fee of Rs.1180/- (inclusive of 18% GST) that will be retained by ASCL.
7. The date of re-examination for the DCL course will be mutually decided by BVNLCS and ASCL.
8. ASCL shall arrange for appropriate certification of successful students of each batch at its own expense.
9. ASCL and BVNLCS shall jointly grant the certificate to successful students.

## VIII. Cancellation / Ratification

1. This MOU shall initially be in force for a period of one year, and may thereafter be renewed for such period and on such terms as may be mutually agreed.
2. Either party to this MOU is at liberty to terminate and / or ratify and / or cancel this MOU by giving a prior notice of at least two months.
3. In the event of termination of this MOU before the completion of a batch, both parties shall ensure the successful completion of the course by the said batch.

### C. Miscellaneous provisions

#### 1. Force Majeure

If a party is prevented from or delayed in carrying out any provision of this MOU by reason of **Force Majeure**, as defined in the definition clause, the party whose performance is so prevented or delayed, upon prompt notice to the other party, shall be excused from such performance, to the extent and during the period of such prevention or delay.

#### 2. Governing Law

This MOU will be governed and construed in accordance with the laws of India.

#### 3. Arbitration

In case of any dispute etc. the decision of an arbitrator appointed by both parties jointly shall prevail and will be binding on both parties.

The provisions of this clause shall survive the termination of the MOU.

#### 4. Assignment

Neither party shall assign this MOU to a third party without the prior written / electronic consent of the other party.

#### 5. Variation and Waiver

No variation of any of the terms of the MOU shall be binding unless confirmed in writing or through electronic mail and no failure, delay, relaxation or forbearance on the part of either party in exercising any power or right under this MOU shall operate as a waiver of such power or right.

Failure of a Party to insist upon strict and punctual performance of any provision hereof shall neither constitute a waiver of, or estoppel against asserting, the right to require such performance, nor shall such failure in one case constitute a waiver or estoppel with respect to a later case.

#### 6. Entirety

This MOU is the entire MOU recording the broad understanding between the Parties. Each Party represents that in entering into this MOU it does not rely on any previous representations, whether express or implied, or on any prior inducement or MOU of any kind or nature. All prior negotiations, representations, letters of intent or MOUs concerning the subject matter of this MOU are hereby deemed cancelled.

**7. Relationship**

Nothing herein shall be deemed to constitute the Parties, or any of them, as partners, association, agent of each other nor shall anything contained herein deem to confer on any Party any authority to incur any obligations or liability on behalf of the other Party nor shall have the power to obligate or bind the other in any way whatsoever, except as provided herein.

**8. Miscellaneous**

This MOU shall be interpreted, having regard to its underlying business purposes, in a reasonable and commercial manner rather than in strict accordance with the literal meaning of the language used.








## 11. GOVERNING LAWS AND ARBITRATION

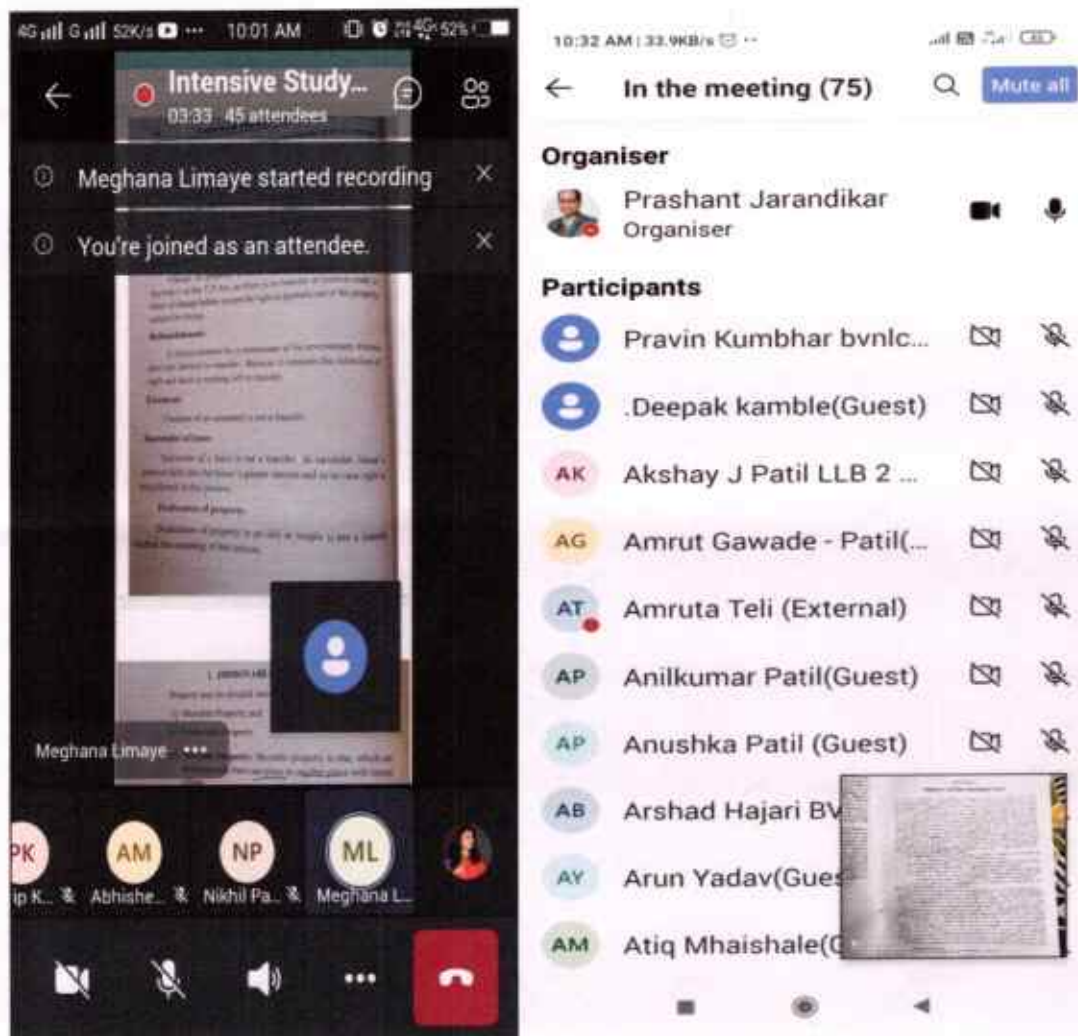
Intensive Study programme provide the students with a better opportunity to revise all the important topics and key concepts that you have studied during your exam preparation.
