- Students were generally satisfied with the classroom and practical teaching, Library and computer facilities, English language laboratory.
- More efforts need to be taken for student to secure ranks in university examinations.
- More efforts to be taken to organize program to motivate students for Judicial and other competitive exams.

d) Other Stakeholders




- Alumni are taking good interest in college. College should involve alumni in more numbers and make effective use of their expertise.
