#### **COURSE STRUCTURE - Law Programmes**

The college offers the following academic programmes.

- (Five Years Law Course), eligibility students who have passed the 12th standard examinations with minimum of 45% marks in aggregate. (40% in case of SC/ST.) + MH-Law CET Pass.
- (Three Years Law Course) eligibility graduates or post graduates in any faculty with minimum of 45 % marks in aggregate. (40% in case of SC/ST.) + MH-Law CET Pass.

#### **COURSE DETAILS:**

Revised Rules & Syllabi of the Three Years LL.B. Degree Course & Five Year LL.B. Degree Course.

- R. Law 4: The 3 Year LL.B. Degree Course shall be of Six Semester Full time course leading to LL.B. (Special)

  Degree. LL.B. (General) Degree will be conferred after completing four Semesters.
- R. Law 5: Each Theory Paper of each Semester will be of 100 or 70 marks except four Practical training Papers. The scheme of marking for practical training papers shall be as follows.

As per BCI Part IV Rules, at Schedule III Rule 25- Compulsory Clinical Courses, at Page no.24 and, Rule 25- Minimum Period of internship at Schedule III at Page 34. Students will have option to maintain the record of Practical Training work either in English or in Marathi. For each practical Training paper the record of the attendance and performance of the students in practical work / project / seminar etc. shall be verified by examiner appointed by the University in the month of Oct./Nov. or March/April every year.

Minimum Period of Internship: (a) Each registered student shall have completed minimum of 12 weeks internship for the Three year law program and 20 weeks in case of Five year law program during the Vacation after term-end through entire period of legal studies under NGO, Trial and Appellate Advocates, Judiciary, Legal Regulatory authorities, Legislatures and Parliament, other legal Functionaries, Market Institutions, Law Firms, Companies, Local self Government and other such bodies where law is practiced either in action or in dispute resolution or in management.

Provided that internship in any year cannot be for a continuous period of more than Four Weeks and all students shall at least gone through once in the entire academic period with Trial and Appellate Advocates.

(b) Each student shall keep internship diary and the same shall be evaluated by the Guide in Internship and also a Core Faculty member of the staff every year. The total mark shall be assessed in the Final Semester of the Course in the Practical Training paper based on the attendance of student during entire internship period.

R. Law. 6: There shall be examination at the end of each semester.

Both the Law courses shall be conducted in semester system in not less than 15 weeks for Three Year Law Course or not less than 18 weeks in Five year Law Course with not less than 30 class - hours per week, including tutorials, moot room exercise and seminars provided there shall be at least 20 lecture hours per week.

- R. Law. 7: The LL.B. Degree in either of the courses in Law will not be conferred upon a candidate unless the candidate has passed in all the papers prescribed for each semester examination.
- R. Law. 8: The college may be allowed to admit students for the entire Academic year i.e. for both the semesters during the Academic Year at one time.
- R. Law. 9: No student of any of the degree program shall be allowed to take the end semester test in a subject if the student concerned has not attended minimum of 70% of the classes held in the subject concerned as also the moot court room exercises, tutorials and practical training conducted in the subject taken together.

Provided that if a student for any exceptional reasons fail to attend 70% of the classes held in any subject the Dean of the University or the Principal of the centre of Legal Education as the case may allow the student to take the test if the student concerned attended at least 65% of the classes held in the subject concerned and attended 70% of classes in all the subjects taken together. The similar power shall rest with the Vice Chancellor or Director of a National Law University, or his authorized representative is the absence of the Dean of Law.

Provided further that a list of such students allowed to take the test with reasons recorded be forwarded to the Bar Council of India.

#### THREE YEAR LAW COURSE

R. Law. 10: Standard of passing - A candidate shall be declared passed in the examination of semester, if he has secured 40 % of the total marks in every paper. However, the conditions of Aggregate marks for 5th & 6th semester of Three year Law Course & 9th & 10th Semesters of Five year LL.B. Degree Course will be 50% marks.

Of the successful candidate, those who secure 60% or more marks shall be placed in First Class and the rest in Second class.

The candidate shall also be entitled to the benefit of Grace Marks as per University Rules.

- R. Law. 11.: Exemption: The student may be exempted at his choice from appearing in any of the papers if he has secured 40% of the total marks in the papers of 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup>, 6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup>, & 8<sup>th</sup> semester of Five year Law Course and 1<sup>st</sup>,2<sup>nd</sup>,3<sup>rd</sup>,& 4<sup>th</sup> semester of Three year Law course and 50% of the total marks in the papers of 9<sup>th</sup> & 10<sup>th</sup> semester of Five year Law Course, and 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> semester of Three year Law Course. The benefit of exemption so earned will be available for six years only.
- R. Law. 12: To pass any of the semester Examination, a student must have passed in all the papers of that semester.
- R. Law. 13: The result of the candidate appearing at 4th, 6th, 8th and 10th semester of Five year LL.B. Course shall not be declared unless and until the candidate has been declared passed in all the papers up to 2nd 4th, 6th, and 8th semester respectively.
- R. Law. 14: The result of the candidate appearing at 4th and 6th semester of Three year LL.B. Course shall not be declared unless and until the candidate has been declared 'passed 'in all the papers up to 2nd and 4th semester respectively.

## R. Law. 15: Eligibility for admissions to Three Year LL.B.

- i) MH Law CET Pass.
- ii) 1st semester For admission to the 1st semester of Three Year LL.B. Course. A student must have passed Bachelor's or Master's Degree Examination in any Faculty of a recognized university with minimum 45% of marks (including Grace Marks) at the qualifying examination. However, the above percentage of marks will be 40% for the students belonging to SC/ST categories.

Provided that such a minimum qualifying marks shall not automatically entitle a person to get admission into an institution but only shall entitle the person concerned to fulfil other institutional criteria notified by the institution concerned or by the government concerned from time to time to apply for admission.

- eligible for admission to the 2<sup>nd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, and 6<sup>th</sup> semester must have successfully kept the terms for the 1<sup>st</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, & 5<sup>th</sup> semester respectively, irrespective of the result of those semester examination.
- iv) 3<sup>rd</sup> Semester A student for being eligible for admission to the 3<sup>rd</sup> semester must have either passed in the 1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>nd</sup> semester or must have got exemption in at least three (ATKT) papers of the 1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>nd</sup> semester.

Law. 11.: Exemption: The student may be exempted at his choice from appearing in any of the papers if he has secured 40% of the total marks in the papers of 1st 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup>, 6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup>, & 8<sup>th</sup> semester of Five year Law Course and Ist, 2nd, 3rd, & 4th semester of Three year Law course and 50% of the total marks in the papers of 9th & 10th semester of Five year Law Course, and 5th and 6th semester of Three year Law Course. The benefit of exemption so earned will be available for six years only.
- R. Law. 12: To pas any of the semester Examination, a student must have passed in all the papers of that semester.
- R. Law. 13: The result of the candidate appearing at 4th, 6th, 8th and 10th semester of Five year LL.B. Course shall not be declared unless and until the candidate has been declared 'passed 'in all the papers up to 2<sup>nd</sup> ,4th, 6th, and 8th semester respectively.
- R. Law. 14: The result of the candidate appearing at 4th and 6th semester of Three year LL.B. Course shall not be declared unless and until the candidate has been declared 'passed 'in all the papers up to 2nd and 4h semester respectively.
- R. Law. 15: Eligibility for admissions to Five Year LL.B. Course.
  - i) MH Law CET Pass.
  - ii) 1st semester For admission to the 1st semester of Five Year LL.B. Course. A student must have

passed H.S.C Examination (10+2 Pattern) or equivalent qualification with minimum 45% of marks at the qualifying examination. However, the above percentage of marks will be 40% for the students belonging to SC/ST categories.

Provided that such a minimum qualifying marks shall not automatically entitle a person to get admission into an institution but only shall entitle the person concerned to fulfil other institutional criteria notified by the institution concerned or by the government concerned from time to time to apply for admission. Also provided that applicants who have obtained 10+2 Higher Secondary Pass Certificate after prosecuting studies in distance or correspondence method shall also be considered as eligible for admission in the Integrated Five Years course.

Explanation: The applicants who have obtained 10+2 through open University system directly without having any basic qualification for prosecuting such studies are not eligible for admission in the law courses.

- iii) 2<sup>nd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, 6<sup>th</sup>, 8<sup>th</sup>, and 10<sup>th</sup> semester A student for being eligible for admission to the 2<sup>nd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>,6<sup>th</sup>, 8<sup>th</sup>, and 10<sup>th</sup> semester must have successfully kept the terms for the I<sup>st</sup>,3<sup>rd</sup>,5<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup>,and 9<sup>th</sup> semester respectively, irrespective of the result of those semester examination.
- iv) 3<sup>rd</sup> Semester A student for being eligible for admission to the 3<sup>rd</sup> semester must have either passed in the 1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>nd</sup> semester or must have got exemption in at least two papers of the 1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>nd</sup> semester.
- v) 5<sup>th</sup> Semester A student for being eligible for admission to the 5<sup>th</sup> semester must have either passed in the 3<sup>rd</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup> semester or must have got exemption in at least two papers of the 3<sup>rd</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup> semester.
- vi) 7th Semester A student for being eligible for admission to the 7th semester must have either passed in the 5th & 6th semester or must have got

exemption in at least three papers of the 5th & 6th

vii) 9th Semester - A student for being eligible for admission to the 9th semester must have either passed in the 7th & 8th semester or must have either exemption in at least three papers of the 7th & 8th semester.

R. Law. 16: Rules for internal evaluation for both the Law
Courses:

Each paper of Five years law course shall consist of 100 marks. except Practical training Papers. For Pre-Law III, IV, V, year.

Out of 100 marks for each paper (except practical Trainning papers) there shall be theory examination conducted by the University carrying 100 marks.

Internal Examination will be compulsory for all students may reappear in the subsequent attempt (to be given at least twice by the college) but before the end of April in that academic year only. However, ATKT rules shall be made applicable in respect of theory and practical head of passing only.)

## INFORMATION FOR THE STUDENTS SEEKING GOVT CONCESSION:

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- Govt. concession for which he is eligible and shall produce documentary evidence at the time of Admission.
- 2) All students entitled to Govt. concession shall be admitted on payment of concessional admission fees. In case the Govt. concession is not awarded, these students will have to pay remaining fee immediately.
- All the students who are eligible for Govt. Concession will be required to fill on line application for scholarship and sumit

- 5) Students entitled to any of these concessions should ascertain from the college office their eligibility for the particular concession for Law Course & apply for the same within eight days from the date of their admission.
- 6) Such students should try to be on college roll from the very first days of the academic year to fulfill the attendance and progress requirements strictly laid down by the Government.
- Admission will be given strictly as per the rules of Shivaji University.

#### CODE OF CONDUCT FOR STUDENTS:
